Shooting Sports

Summer shooting sports is taking place – shotgun is held on Tuesday evenings at the Brookings Gun Club and Muzzle loading is held on Monday evenings at Beacon Hill. Thirty-three 4-H members are participating under the leadership of 4 trained volunteers. Match 1 ended on July 15; Match 2 will end on August 31. The state shoot will take place in Mitchell on the weekend of September 8-10.

Summer Events

4-H Special Foods workshop was held at the end of May for youth to learn the ins and outs of the nutrition-based cooking contest. The local contest was held in Volga on July 12 with 21 participants. Youth are expected to complete their recipe, complete a nutrition interview, and set the table within a 90-minute time frame. All the finished products tasted amazing – the recipes will be available in our 2023 4-H Special Foods Cookbook soon! All contestants are eligible to compete at the State Fair Contest held in Huron, August 31 – September 2.

21 youth and adults from Brookings County attending 4-H camp at Lake Poinsett between June 1 – June 10. The weather was perfect, and the camp sessions went well. In addition to our campers, Brookings County had 2 camp counselors, and one served as the Lead Counselor responsible for most of the camp schedule, except for the educational programming.

Local day camps for Cloverbud members (ages 5-7) and Beginner 4-H members (8-10) were held June 8, 15, and 22 at the BCOAC. Day camps were conducted by the summer interns and each session had a different theme and set of activities. Thirty-two youth completed one or more sessions of the summer day camps; youth volunteers helped with the small groups and offered one-on-one help.

The Brookings County 4-H Horse Show was at the Swiftel Center Tuesday, June 20. Weekly horse practice started on Monday, May 8 and continued up to the horse show. Thirteen 4-H members competed in the horse show and four of them participated in the State 4-H Horse Show, that took place in Ft. Pierre, July 24-26.

4-H Dog Show practice started on May 18 and ended with the 4-H Dog Show on Monday, July 17. The dog project is led by Kristie Thompson, Bailey Merry, and Lane Thompson. There were 13 participants; the State Dog Show will be a regional event this year offered in three locations in August and September.

Additional 4-H events that took place during the month of June and July included the Public Presentation Contest, Consumer Decision Making judging, and the Fashion Revue Contest. This concluded all our youth in action events for 2023.

Achievement Days will be held at the Dacotah Bank Center, July 31 - August 3. We set up on Wednesday, July 26. We are excited for a variety of food truck vendors and food options through the week, the Showring Cinema, and our 4-H BBQ on Thursday evening complete with the fashion revue program and Good Neighbor Award Presentation. Thursday night will feature the 2nd Annual Sale of Champions which will take place at 7 pm prior to the Round Robin Senior Showmanship Contest. A complete schedule of achievement day events was featured in the Yellow Paper the week of July 24 and additional details can be found on our Brookings County 4-H Facebook page.

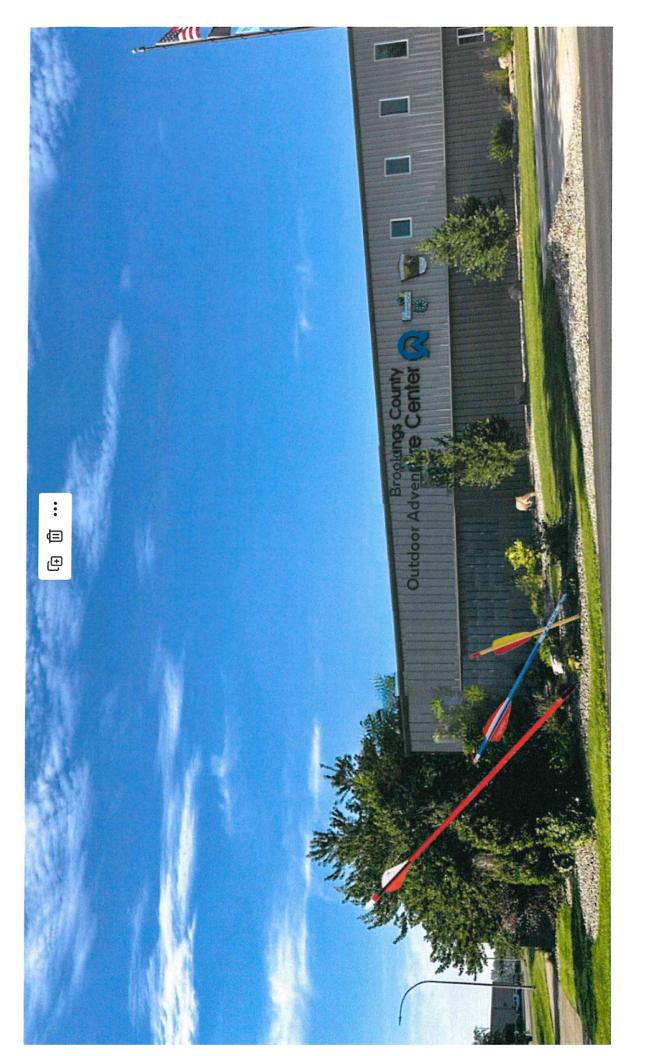
